


Look out for...



- Hares can reach speeds of up to 45 miles an hour!
- They have fantastic camouflage, lying still in a slight depression called a 'form'.
- In 'Mad March' you may see two hares 'boxing' when a female becomes fed up with being chased by a male!



- These are big birds! Their wingspan is over one metre.
- No tweets or chirps for this bird- they have a high pitched 'mew' like a cat!
- They can be seen for most of the year large brown birds with a pale underside and a fanned tail.



- Muntjac deer are not native to Britain they were introduced to Woburn Park in the 20th Century and are now very widespread.
- These are small, stocky deer, originating from China.
- They now pose a threat to woodlands, as they eat bark, tree shoots and graze undergrowth that is a habitat for insects and birds.

- The kestrel is a hunter, and one of the most common birds of prey.
- They can see ultraviolet light which means that they can spot the urine trails of the small mammals they feed on!
- They usually hover into the wind and use their long tails to balance and hold position in the air.



- Foxes are members of the dog family.
- Their habitat and diet are very varied, and they are very adaptable. They can live in all sorts of places - dens in the countryside or behind bins in the city.
- Foxes are sociable animals, living in loose family groups and occupying burrows called dens.
